


Tina Matejka sporting her CDCT swag with partner KRVP Freddie Bar Mac (also known as Riddles).

SELF-LIMITING THOUGHTS

For this week's tip I'd like to talk about how to get rid of your self limiting beliefs, and how to create new beliefs for your success.

Self limiting beliefs are thoughts we have about ourselves as riders and trainers that are holding us back from our true potential; "I started dressage too old so I will never be a good rider", "I am not good enough to enter a show", "I am not a good enough horseman to teach lessons",... Very commonly we are not even aware of these beliefs. They are unconscious and very often in the horse industry these are also projected on to our horses: "my horse will never have the potential to be reaching this or this level", "my horse wouldn't be physically capable to do this movement", "I will never get a good score because judges don't like this breed".

Self limiting beliefs usually come from our past, what our caretakers said about us, our upbringing, and of course come from what our first trainers said about us.

When you feel that your not a good rider because you are too short, too big, or too old, lack coordination or feel, it most likely comes from something hurtful that has been said to you, or something that you have perceived as hurtful. This becomes a truth to ourselves, but this is not necessarily an absolute truth.

Our results (training progress, winning competitions etc) are all driven by actions generated by thoughts that we can achieve it. The issue is that when we have limiting beliefs about ourselves, waking up one day and trying to convince ourselves that we are worthy and repeating it in front of the mirror might not work.

What I've personally found is that in order to create new beliefs and strive to evolve, I had to identify all the self limiting beliefs I had and disprove them one by one.

See your self limiting belief system as a house of cards. Each layer of cards is supported by events from our past that reinforce the belief, all the way to our childhood. The work that needs to be done first is to write down what you think holds you back, and write down all the supporting elements that come to your mind.

If I give you an example with my own experience, when I considered to make a switch from being an engineer with a 6 figures salary to full time trainer, my self limiting belief was that I wouldn't be able to support myself financially. To support this idea, I would think that I would lose my health benefits, that most trainers don't make a lot of money, let alone make any, that my family would disapprove my decision, that my former colleague would be disappointed etc.

In order to move forward towards our dreams, we have to first tear down the house of cards. Layer by layer, by asking the question "is that absolutely true?", and find examples that it's not.

Are all the trainers broke? Certainly not.

Could I loose my engineer job and my benefits by being laid off? Absolutely. That sense of security I had was all subjective.

Would my family support my decision to pursue my dream? They would support me if that is what makes me happy.

Are we too short to be a dressage rider? Debbie McDonald is shorter than me!

Are you too old to be a good dressage rider? Well check until what age Nuño Oliveira was training stallions better than many of us may ever could!

Is your horse to average to go to a show? Shows are full of average horses, and if you ride an accurate and correct test, you can get a decent score, and beat a few big moving warmbloods. I have a long list of students riding "average" horses and doing well.

By tearing down the house of cards of limiting beliefs, it makes it possible to then set new objectives and new actions plans. It is not an easy process because very often it involves going very deep in "truths" that have built our identify beyond the sport and beyond your relationship with the horses. It can be quite a paradigm shift.

All tests are the 2019 USEF Dressage Tests.

All scores from the USDF dressage tests will be reported to USDF for inclusion in the Schooling Show Series Awards. To be considered for an award, you must be an active member in a USDF recognized GMO at the time of the show. Please see the addended set of rules for the USDF schooling show series at the bottom of this prize list. Please provide a copy of your USDF membership verification with your entry if you wish your scores to count.

RULES:

COVID safety guidelines and rules will be in place for everyone's safety.

Show starts at 8:30 A.M.; Ends with the last test ride (RAIN OR SHINE) Indoor dressage ring; warm-up outdoor ring, weather dependent Show is informal; dress code--tidy (braids are optional). ASTM/SEI certified helmet required when mounted.

Ride times will be posted on CDCT's website on Thursday before the show Current Negative Coggins & Rabies Certificate are required – send copy with application.

The stall fee is for a <u>half day only-dependant on the schedule of your rides.</u> We request that you strip your stall before leaving so it can be ready for the next horse coming in. Thank you for your consideration in this matter.

Special leadline class: \$10 (Indicate LEADLINE on entry form: no class number)

Youth (21 and under): half price for all classes

Changes on day of show: \$15 per class. Note: In the event of a test change, your ride times will NOT change. There will be no refunds for changes or cancellations after the closing date, no shows or same day cancellations.

COVID CONSIDERATIONS: We ask your cooperation with the following for the well-being of all and in consideration of this difficult times. We will do our best to keep everyone safe.

- 1. Entries must be RECEIVED by the closing date. Please plan accordingly. If we have to cancel the show for COVID reasons, all entry fees will be refunded. Acts of God (other than plagues or locusts) not refunded. Please mail entries on time. No exceptions on this.
- 2. We will not have an in-person office. A manager will be on the show grounds at all times to answer questions and address concerns, but check in will be self-service. For this reason, you must be paid in full and have all necessary paperwork before you will be allowed to unload your horse. Your tests will be scored and your awards mailed to you at the end of the show. Indicate preferred mailing address on entry. Results will be posted the same day on our Facebook page and within a few days on our webpage. We will do our best to personally phone or text all competitors with results as a courtesy in these strange times.
- 3. All persons on the show grounds must wear a mask or face shield at all times unless mounted or outside and at least six feet from other participants. We ask that you not make management police this. If you have a medical dispensation that prohibits you from using a mask, please bring a face shield. If you can wear neither a mask nor a face shield when unmounted, we ask that you refrain from coming to our show this year and join us when things are more stable.
- 4. When not on your horse, please maintain social distance from other competitors and any spectators. Assume everyone else is a boss mare and you are but a shy gelding and keep your distance.
- 5. We will be limiting the number of riders on the grounds. We will have morning groups (two to three sets) and afternoon groups. (two to three sets) You may ask to be grouped with friends on your entry so that you can enjoy the show together. We ask that you not show up at the show grounds more than two hours before your first ride or that of a person in your group if trailering together. We ask that if possible, you exit the show after your rides are finished so that we can keep the number of participants low.
- 6. Tests will not necessarily be ridden sequentially. If you are coming with a group of friends, we will try to group all of your rides together, regardless of level. Riders will have at least two test rides, but not more than four, between their rides. There will be no more than five horses in the warm-up ring at any time.

- 7. We ask that you limit the number of spectators who might come with you to **one or two per rider.** Spectators agree to be bound by social distancing and mask/face shield rules and agree to all our guidelines for a safe show. All chairs must be at least six feet apart.
- 8. Please bring your own refreshments as none will be provided this year unless deemed infeasible by management. Management reserves the right to cancel, combine, or change the timing of classes as deemed necessary for the smooth running of the show.

Total number of tests cannot exceed three.

High Score Awards: High Score Youth Under 14, High Score Youth 14-21, High Score of Show, Youth Sportsmanship Award (for youth competitor showing exceptional character in their care of their horse and treatment of other competitors), Level Champion and Reserve Level Champion (if level has more than five entries).

Special Awards: (provided by club members) Youngest Rider to Enter at A; Norwegian Fjord etc. Horse; additional prizes to be announced.

Vaccines: All competitors are required to provide proof of a Rabies vaccination, EHV/Flu-Rhino and negative Coggins to compete in this show.

Please do not bring your dogs. PLEASE, NO DOGS.

Limited stalls are available. There is ample space to show off your trailer at this show. Grounds are quiet and safe.

Ride times: Times will be posted on our club website www.cayugadressage.org within three days of the show. Management reserves the right to change ride times until the morning of the show in the event of unforeseen weather events. No refunds for Acts of God cancellation.

General Information & Links

To encourage the retraining of Thoroughbreds into other disciplines upon completion of careers in racing or breeding, The Jockey Club created the Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P.). T.I.P. has a number of programs geared toward all riders and Thoroughbreds. Generally, all information on T.I.P. programs can be found on our website (tictip.com) under "TB Owners & Riders".

<u>Eligibility</u> - For purposes of eligibility for all T.I.P. classes and awards, a "Thoroughbred" is defined as any horse that has been registered with The Jockey Club or a foreign Thoroughbred stud book recognized by The Jockey Club. Unregistered horses are not eligible.

<u>T.I.P. Numbers -</u> To participate in T.I.P., owners and riders must obtain a T.I.P. Number. To apply for a T.I.P. number, please visit <u>tjctip.com</u> and click on "My Account". You will need an Interactive Registration™ account to apply for a T.I.P. Number. Interactive Registration™ is a FREE service designed for the use of thoroughbred owners and breeders to transact business electronically with The Jockey Club registry. T.I.P. Numbers are free. The T.I.P. number card should be provided to participating horse shows as proof of eligibility.

- T.I.P. Numbers are horse/owner specific. If you purchase a horse with a number, you need to get a new T.I.P. Number for the horse under your own account.
- All riders must be listed on the T.I.P. Number to add a rider, log into your account and click "Add Rider"

<u>Horse Show Awards</u> – T.I.P. offers sponsorship of Thoroughbred classes and high point awards at approved horse shows in virtually all disciplines, including hunter/jumper, eventing, dressage, Western, polo, polocrosse, and endurance.

<u>Performance Awards</u> – The Performance Awards are T.I.P.'s year end, self-reported Thoroughbred "points program". The Performance Awards are completely self-reported by the Thoroughbred's owner or rider. The Award Year is December 1 - November 30 and all forms are due December 20.

<u>Recreational Riding Program</u> – The Thoroughbred Recreational Riding Incentive Program (TRRIP) is designed to recognize and reward Thoroughbred owners and riders that enjoy recreational riding or driving on a regular basis. There are prizes associated with each hour level, beginning with 25 hours.

<u>Championships</u> –The Jockey Club hosts an all Thoroughbred Championship Horse Show with championship divisions for Hunters, Jumpers, English Pleasure, Dressage and Western Pleasure. T.I.P. offers championship awards for eventing at the United States Eventing Association's American Eventing Championships.

<u>Young Rider and Non-Competition Programs</u> – T.I.P. offers a Young Rider of the Year Award and a Youth Ambassador Program as well as a Thoroughbred of the Year Award which recognizes a Thoroughbred that has excelled in a non-competitive career, such as equine-assisted therapy or police work.

Refusals and knock-downs will be penalized as an error of course with appropriate deduction of points. Knock-downs will be penalized at the judge's discretion. In the case of a rail in the path, the judge will ring the bell for the rider to stop without penalty. After the jump is replaced, the bell will be rung again telling the rider to continue from where he stopped. Score will be calculated in percentage.





Refusals will be penalized as an error of course with appropriate deduction of points. Knock-downs will be penalized at the judge's discretion. In the case of a knocked-down rail in the path, the judge will ring the bell for the rider to stop without penalty. 
